Welcome to Valley Manor Matter's 2024 winter newsletter.

This is our first newsletter of 2024 and we are so eager to share all of the exciting updates and news that has been happening here at Valley Manor.

The exit of 2023 presented a great deal of change for Valley Manor. There were a number of staff and senior leaders that retired which left us with a large new compliment of leaders.

Although recruitment for these key positions was rigorous and challenging and we expanded the demographic of the search throughout the county, I am very pleased with our new ambitious team of leaders. They will all be featured in this edition of our winter newsletter.

On another note, Valley Manor was successful in securing a new van for all of our residents, which has the capacity to seat more than one resident at a time. The van has been enjoyed by many already, and it has even made an appearance at the Barry's Bay Santa Claus parade with a group of our residents and staff. Thank you to our staff and residents that participated to represent Valley Manor in the parade.

We have also started off the new year with an extensive replacement of all fabric furniture throughout the facility and in the resident rooms. This incentive has been funded by the Ministry of Long-Term Care through the surplus pandemic funding. All of the furniture was replaced with Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC) approved, wipeable material. Additionally, we were able to utilize more of this pandemic funding to remove the carpets throughout the home and replace them with infection control approved laminate flooring. Thank you for your patience while we made these necessary changes to keep our home compliant with best practices in infection control standards in healthcare.

We also celebrated our staff appreciation & long service awards in January, which included several 30-year and 40-year anniversary celebrations for our staff. Congratulations to the entire team for their dedication and commitment to Valley Manor.

We are slowly and steadily, moving forward with replacing our frontline healthcare staff here at the Manor, post pandemic. Recruitment in long-term care throughout the province has been extremely difficult, despite all of the incentives that the MLTC is providing due to the fact that there is an actual shortage of people in the workforce. Valley Manor will continue to utilize agency services to ensure the facility is staffed accordingly, however, we are making great strides and filling positions which has improved our staffing compliment for the better. A robust Human Resources plan has been implemented which includes recruitment and referral bonuses for new hires in addition to many other plans.

The St. Francis Valley Healthcare Foundation has recently approved funding to purchase much needed resident equipment for the home. This equipment will be transferrable to the new Valley Manor and we will start by using it in our current home. This equipment includes new mattresses, new wardrobes in resident

rooms, new wheelchairs, new bariatric chairs and new Broda chairs to name a few. Valley Manor is grateful for all of the generous donors in our community which assist us with the purchase of these important items.

The redevelopment planning has been delayed due to the continuous increases in construction costs to redevelop. Small rural, not for profit homes are having the greatest challenge to get the shovel in the ground due to enormous cost escalations. Valley Manor continues to work closely with our MPP John Yakabuski, our advocacy group Advantage Ontario and the MLTC to increase funding once again so that we can bring the redevelopment of Valley Manor to fruition. The plans are in place, the redesign is queued for completion and now we just need to close the funding gap with the assistance of the aforementioned partners.

In November 2023, Valley Manor also welcomed a new Board of Directors. After 25 years serving Valley Manor, Kathy Marion has hung up her hat as Board Chair and Board Director, which has paved way for a natural progression of current and new Board members. Bill Rodnick is our new Board Chair; Annabel Marsh is the Vice Chair and Jill Vermaire is the Secretary/Treasurer. We also welcomed 2 new members who are currently completing the orientation process. Please refer to the Valley Manor website for Board information and updates.

I would like to wish you all a peaceful 2024. I look forward to a prosperous and positive year at Valley Manor which has already proven to be extremely productive already.


Palliative and "End-of-Life" Care...What's the Difference?

Palliative Care is an approach that *focuses on improving the quality of life for residents with life-limiting illnesses* and their families in accordance with the resident's values and preferences. It is the prevention and relief of suffering through early identification, assessment, and treatment of holistic symptoms, including physical, social, psychological, spiritual, and emotional. Palliative care is the approach. The resident is not "palliative".

End-of-Life Care occurs in the last part of a resident's life, usually in the last days, weeks, or months of life. It includes helping persons and their families prepare for death, ensuring their comfort and supporting decision-making that is consistent with the person's prognosis and goals of care.

Palliative care and end-of-life care are often lumped together as one term. It is very important to understand that they are different. Palliative care includes end-of life care, but palliative care is not strictly end-of-life care. It is so much more!

Valley Manor has a multidisciplinary team that embraces the Palliative Approach to improve quality of life for our residents. If you wish to discuss this approach, please reach out to Jason Smith (Program Lead) or Gail Yantha (Director of Care).

With some brainstorming, and our present staff being open to change, we have changed our Activity Lines (adding in weekends shifts for all Activity Staff), and hired a 1 New Full-Time Staff, Brayden Mayhew and one Part-Time staff, Christine Wood. At Valley Manor we try to make many of our Activities, "Home-Style." From planting a vegetable garden annually, cutting strawberries and beans in the summertime, to our monthly baking programs, we maintain many of our resident's former abilities and interests in the activities that we program. It was brought to my attention by a family member in May that one of our residents really missed folding laundry, as that was something that she did in her daily routine at home. Manager of Recreation and Volunteers, Lisa Yantha reached out to the past Food Services and Support Manager, Amanda Pinto and asked if this was a program that we could do with our residents. Amanda, agreed that it was a great idea, and we developed and implemented a group every Monday morning, called "Handy Helpers." At this program, we model to the residents, how the Laundry Department would like the towels folded, and then it is GO-



TIME!! You can tell our residents are experienced; they are able to fold two large bags of towels in 20 min! It is what people would call a win-win program.

The Laundry Department is very grateful for the help that they receive from our residents, and the residents feel valued and accomplished for the work that they completed! Our program started off with approx. 5 residents and has now increased to 10 residents.

CMI – Case Mix Index - UPDATE

For reference, the Case Mix Index is the numeric value (also known as CMI weight) assigned to a longterm care home and is used as a measure of the average care requirements of residents in that longterm care home. It is reflective of the relative resources predicted to provide care to a resident. A higher

CMI means that such facility treated a significant number of resource-intensive patients which in turn results in a higher reimbursement rate for that facility.

Our current CMI for the 2023 2nd quarter (July, August, September) was 1.2. The Valley Manor CMI remains above the regional (Champlain LHIN) and provincial averages. The average CMI for the region is

1.11 while the average for the province is 1.14.

Below is a comparative graph of the CMI trends for Valley Manor, Champlain LHIN and Ontario.
